

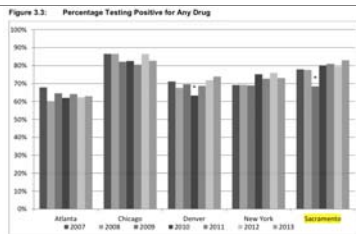

2013 Arrestee Drug Abuse Monitoring: Annual Report Office of National Drug Control Policy

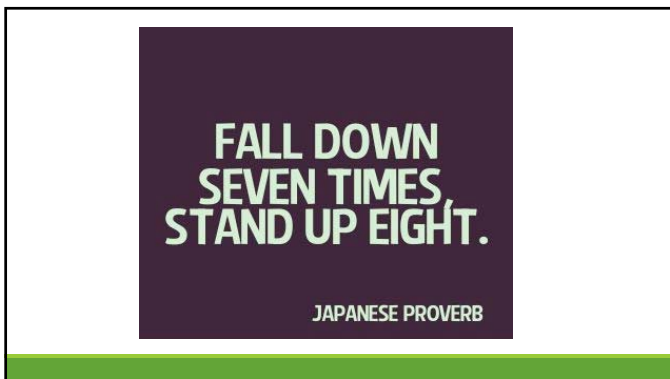




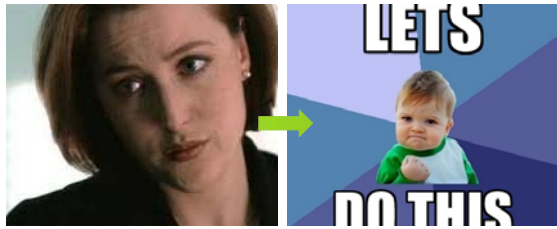
